



Is strategic thinking one of the most important skills for a leader?

Welcome to the Strategic Thinking self-paced module. Strategic thinking is different from strategic planning. In many respects, it is even more important than strategic planning. To think strategically means to see and understand the bigger picture of what the organization is, where it needs to go, and how it will get there. It means anticipating opportunities and challenges and utilizing that knowledge to guide the organization. As you process in your career and reach management/ leadership levels, strategic thinking becomes a critical skill for you to build and hone.

What is strategic thinking?

Strategic thinking skills are any skills that enable you to use critical thinking to solve complex problems and plan for the future. These skills are essential to accomplish business objectives, overcome obstacles, and address challenges—particularly if they're projected to take weeks, months, or even years to achieve.

How to be more strategic?

Take chances. Don't just always do the same things, the same way. Status quo won't get you to the next level.

Think outside of the box. It's pretty cliché, but try to think differently. Turn things upside down. Consider all the angles.

Always add value. Strategic thinkers are always looking for ways to improve a process, make more money, etc.

Look for ways to beat the competition. How can you be better than everyone else?

Consider the big picture. Don't work in a silo. Having a broader vision will help you and your company.

Find answers. Seek out explanations and solutions. Just because they are not right in front of you doesn't mean you shouldn't make the effort.

Try not to get stuck in a rut. It can be hard not to get caught up in the daily grind. Look for ways to take on new projects and expand your horizons.

Surround yourself with great thinkers. Talk to other strategic, innovative thinkers. It can help your own thought process.

Constantly question things. Get comfortable asking "Why?" Challenge how things are done.

Listen to others. Evaluate the opinions of others. You can't solve everything on your own.

Strategic thinking skills include:

- Analytical skills: To ideate a strategy that helps your organization reach its objectives, you
 must be capable of analyzing a variety of inputs—from financial statements and KPIs, to
 market conditions, emerging business trends, and internal resource allocation. This initial
 analysis is crucial to creating a strategy that aligns with the current reality facing your
 organization.
- Communication skills: Putting a strategy into place for your company, regardless of its size, requires solid communication skills. The ability to communicate complex ideas, collaborate with internal and external stakeholders, build consensus, and ensure everyone is aligned and working toward shared goals are all central to strategic thinking.
- Problem-solving skills: Strategic planning is often used to solve problems or address challenges, such as missed financial targets, inefficient workflows, or an emerging competitor. Implementing a strategy that addresses the central challenge you face requires

you to first understand the problem and its potential solutions. From there, you can craft a strategy that solves it.

• Planning and management skills: Strategy isn't just about thinking of a solution—it involves implementation, too. Once data has been analyzed, the problem is understood, and a solution has been identified, you need strong planning and management skills to bring everything together.

Develop strategic thinking within your team:

As a leader, it maybe hugely beneficial to develop a leadership practice that exemplifies the skills required for strategic thinking and setting in place processes that will help nurture a work culture where those skills are celebrated. Some tips for developing a team of strategic thinkers:

- Always explain the why. For many managers, the focus is on training employees on what to do or how to do it. Oftentimes the why is forgotten, even though it's absolutely crucial to strategic thinking. The explanation of why helps remind employees of the big picture and aligns your decision making with your strategic plan and vision.
- Challenge assumptions and encourage others to do the same. Good strategic thinking requires good critical thinking: constantly asking questions, defining the problem, and exploring ideas and solutions. If you've been good at explaining the why to your employees, chance are you'll get some employees responding back, but what if? These are the moments that can often spark creativity and innovation.
- Regularly bring different teams together to share diverse perspectives. Your front-line
 employees have the best knowledge of on-the-ground issues, whereas middle management
 may have the best insights on process efficiencies. Marketing may bring great research
 about industry competitors, while your service team may bring great feedback about
 customer satisfaction. Great strategic thinking doesn't happen by keeping this information
 siloed. The more opportunities for sharing knowledge internally, the better the chance for
 creative ideas and solutions to emerge.
- Prioritize and learn to say no. The ability to prioritize is what separates creative thinking from strategic thinking. Strategic leaders know how to evaluate ideas to determine which ones will have the most potential positive impact, and they also understand that knowing when to say "no" is just as important as knowing when to say "yes." Making this process as transparent as possible to your team will help better align them to your overall vision and plan.
- Integrate strategic thinking into your company values. If you want to make strategic thinking a part of your work culture, then you'll need to make it a part of your values. That means recruiting for and rewarding the traits that one needs to be a good strategic thinker, such as curiosity, the ability to quickly learn and adapt, creative problem solving, and strong emotional intelligence. Publicly praise the employees who used strategic thinking to solve a particular problem or achieve a company goal, and promote your best strategic leaders to management positions.
